

**REPORT ON THE CELEBRATION OF THE

National Institute for the Orthopaedically Handicapped, Kolkata (NIOH) celebrated International Day of Persons with Disabilities on **3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2015**.

On the occasion Poster, Slogan, Essay writing, Photography, Inter College debate and Quiz competitions were held in the Institute on the theme decided by UN i.e. **Inclusion Matters: Access & Empowerment for People with All Abilities**.

The highlights of the events of the day were as follows:

**Disability awareness Quiz competition** was held for the PwDs, their care givers and common people.
